Women & Leadership (in public & third sector organisations)

Courses start February 2010, Run in 2 parts, Stratford Campus

This is a six day course working with women to enhance personal and professional effectiveness through:

- Exploring styles and approaches to leadership
- Managing organisational change
- Increasing awareness and knowledge of effective leadership
- Improving communication and presentation skills
- Identifying strategies for achieving personal and professional goals
- Understanding group dynamics and team development
- Building confidence in leadership abilities

The course will be especially useful to women working in public and community services, voluntary groups, women's organisation, community activists, women working independently, women in leadership positions and those wanting to take that step.

The course is workshop based, using a participatory and interactive learning style, which combines experience and reflection with critical analysis of leadership theories and practice.

Part 1 explores:

Listening and communication skills
Leadership styles and approaches
Belbin and Team development
Power and influence in organisations

Part 2 explores:

Habits of highly effective people
Myers Briggs and personality development
Leadership of Radical Change
Presentation skills

Who should participate?

This course is open to women working in public and community services and groups, as employees or on a voluntary basis. It also provides the opportunity to explore whether participants would want to pursue postgraduate level learning towards an MA or MSc or other qualifications.
