On 25th May, MiNet launched its [mapping research](#) into the impact of the economic downturn on BAME education services.

The report gathered evidence from a range of BAME organisations working in the area of education, and local authority commissioners and directors of Children's Services, providing evidence on the vulnerability of smaller organisations, the loss of services whilst stamping the feeling that racism is undoubtedly recession proof. Rob Berkeley, Director of Runnymede Trust and Uvanney Maylor, Reader in Education, University of Bedfordshire, acknowledged the timeliness of the report and commented on the reports importance.
